

Translation of a handwritten Hungarian Declaration drawn up by a bilingual public notary in Hungarian

Declaration

According to which undersigned Antal Klipsch hereby agree, in fact I fervently desire that my wife née Johanna Janosek and our two children: Amália, who is 6 and ½ years old and Antal, 5 years old, would be permitted to emigrate from Resiczebánya to here, America, Cleveland, Ohio, and I promise to welcome them to my home and take care of them completely, to take care of every need of my children beautifully and send them to school and in general I will behave towards them as their loving and caring father.

I make here as a construction worker 350 Koronas (I imagine the Dollars were converted for the sake of the Hungarian authorities) per month, I have some savings and a nice home, therefore I am more than capable to take good care of them.

Therefore, I respectfully ask you to issue a passport for my wife and children. –
